NBA Monitoring COVID Developments, Will Keep Members Informed of Any Denver Restrictions

With the emergence of the Omicron variant of the COVID-19 virus, the NBA is closely monitoring developments regarding public safety, as well as potential mandates that may be in place in Denver during the NBA Winter Conference in January.

With that in mind, NBA President Donnis Baggett and Executive Director Dave Carter sent the following e-message to all NBA membership this week:

Dear NBA Member.

We're looking forward to gathering again in Denver for the 27th annual <u>National Bison Association Winter Conference</u> Jan. 19-22. Because of the current COVID situation, some members are asking, "What will be the requirements and restrictions regarding mask wearing and social distancing?" Our honest answer is that we can't yet say. But at this juncture, here's some context:

Colorado's governor has been resistant to statewide mask mandates since the onset of COVID and has stated his preference for each county or municipality to make these decisions locally. At the request of Denver Mayor Michael Hancock, the City and County of Denver (they operate as a single entity) instituted a mask mandate that's scheduled to expire on January 3, three weeks prior to our winter conference.

Other than the mask requirement, there are no current social distancing mandates for convention events. COVID cases and deaths in Colorado have trended slightly lower in recent weeks, and so far, there has been no indication that the mask mandate will be extended. In addition, the mayor wants to avoid mandates during the National Western Stock Show, which is vitally important to the local economy. All that said, the spread of the omicron variant of COVID has folks wondering what might lie ahead.

We will continue to monitor the situation closely and will keep the NBA family informed of any developments that might impact our winter conference. In the meantime, we wish you a happy holiday season, and hope that you have an opportunity to enjoy this special time with friends and family.

Producers Urged to File Mycoplasma Claims with FSA

Officials from USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) this week repeated their request for bison ranchers to submit their losses from *Mycoplasma bovis* to the agency's local offices in order to document the extent of the impact throughout the bison business.

"We ask that, as you continue to hear from producers, please encourage them to notify their local FSA offices (either by email or by phone, followed up with an email) of any and all losses as soon as possible," FSA policy advisor Riya Mehta wrote the NBA on Thursday.

In November, leadership at USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) responded to a request from National Bison Association to find a new path for relief for bison producers affected by *Mycoplasma* infection and mortality. In previous years, the FSA considered *Mycoplasma* to be a secondary infection in bison, which prevented producers from qualifying for reimbursement for death losses under the agency's Livestock Indemnity Program (LIP). FSA is working now to reconsider that decision. At the FSA's request, the Center of Excellence for Bison Studies (Bison COE) at SDSU is providing aggregated data to inform that decision.

FSA Administrator Zach Ducheneaux told NBA Executive Director Dave Carter this week that the agency is looking at the program requirements for LIP, and for the Emergency Livestock Assistance Program (ELAP), in hopes that coverage can be provided for impacted producers. Ducheneaux urged impacted livestock producers to immediately notify their local FSA office (either by email, or by phone followed up with an email) of death losses incurred because of *Mycoplasma*. That will provide the agency with important evidence documenting the extent of the losses within the bison industry.

"For now, please encourage any of your producers to notify their local FSA office of any and all losses as soon as possible and keep them updated as to further losses they may sustain and ask for an ELAP application," he said. Also, if there is overlap of *Mycoplasma* losses with drought, the USDA requests that that be documented as well to assist with ELAP. Drought conditions for your area over the past year can be determined using the comparison Drought Monitor online tool:

Dave Carter, NBA executive director, said, "Documenting the extent of *Mycoplasma* losses is an important step in demonstrating the severity of this disease in bison herds. That's why it is important for producers to file their losses with their local FSA office.

NBA Junior Judging Event Announced – Honors Larry Higgins

The National Bison Association Junior Judging Program, now renamed as the Larry Higgins Bison Junior Judging Contest, is set for Friday, January 21St, at the National Western Stock Show in Denver.

This free, annual event is open to individuals between 8 - 21 years of age, who are academically eligible (i.e. passing all classes). Participants judge four classes of bison and provide oral reasons on one class, as selected by the judges. Everyone participates individually and is eligible to earn a scholarship. Additional recognition is provided for the top three registered teams and the top three junior participants (12 years of age or younger).

The annual event returns with a total of \$3,200 in scholarship money for the top three contestants. Register ahead of time here: <u>The Larry Higgins Bison Junior Judging Contest - Rocky Mountain Bison Association (bisonranchers.com)</u>

The annual Junior Judging contest was renamed this year for Larry Higgins, longtime champion and promoter of bison who died of cancer in early 2021. Larry shared his knowledge and passion for bison with everyone, including children. In 2008, his son Josiah was the first person to join the NBA as a junior member. Larry saw the value of getting kids, including his own, involved in the industry at a young age. The National Bison Association launched the Junior Judging Contest in 2008 and it wasn't long before Larry volunteered to help. RMBA now partners with the NBA to run the competition. Unfortunately, Larry passed away in 2021. That same year, the event's name was officially changed to The Larry Higgins Bison Junior Judging Contest to memorialize Larry's impact on the bison community.

56 Park Bison Transferred to Tribal Lands

Fifty-six Yellowstone bison have been sent to the Yakama Nation's lands in Washington and the Modoc Nation's lands in Oklahoma.

It's the first time that two large, intact families of bison have been transported to tribal lands through the Bison Conservation Transfer Program — a concerted effort by tribal, state, federal and nonprofit partners to divert more disease-free Yellowstone bison away from slaughter.

"Bison are incredibly social animals, so one of the key goals of this program is to maintain these social structures once they arrive at their new home," said Chamois Andersen, senior Rockies and Plains representative for Defenders of Wildlife, in a news release. "We are honored to partner with the Fort Peck Tribes and ITBC in this important work to bring bison back to the tribes."

Last week, the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service did a final round of brucellosis testing on the 56 bison at the Fort Peck Tribes' quarantine facility. The results all came up negative, and the animals were cleared to be shipped to tribal lands.

Troy Heinert, a member of the Rosebud Sioux Tribe in South Dakota and the executive director of the InterTribal Buffalo Council, was at last week's transfer. He helped to sort the animals by age and demographic, then load them onto trucks.

Fencing Program Helps Build Tolerance for Roaming Bison (From the Billings Gazette)

Keeping bison separated from homeowners can help increase tolerance for the big, shaggy mammals.

To that end, four conservation groups have worked together for 10 years to help offset the cost of bison-proof fencing in the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem. So far, the groups have facilitated the construction of fences on 55 properties, an investment of more than \$50,000 in coexistence.

"As bison return to portions of their historic range, simple solutions like putting up a fence can help avoid unnecessary conflicts and go a long way in helping communities accept these animals' presence on the landscape," said Shana Drimal, wildlife program associate for the Greater Yellowstone Coalition. "A small investment up front can ensure successful coexistence with bison and peace of mind for landowners for years to come."

The Yellowstone Bison Coexistence Program began in 2011 as a way to increase tolerance for wild bison so they may one day be managed like other wildlife in Montana when roaming outside of Yellowstone National Park.

Through this program, participating landowners have received technical assistance and a 50% reimbursement – up to \$1,000 – to construct fencing to keep bison out of gardens, landscaping, yards, playgrounds, or livestock pastures where they can potentially cause damage or come into conflict with people, pets or livestock.

Will Billy the Bison Make It Home for The Holidays?

WAUCONDA, IL — The elusive bison that has been spotted in suburbs throughout Lake

and McHenry counties may be headed home for the holidays.

The 800-pound bison, which has been referred to as Billy and Tyson by her fans on social media, <u>was recently spotted</u> about an eighth of a mile from the Milk & Honey Farmstead in Wauconda, co-owner Scott Comstock of Milk & Honey Farmstead told the Chicago Tribune. Comstock believes the bison is being drawn back to the farm because she misses his sister.

The bison has been wandering the area since she escaped in September.

"It happened when we were unloading the bison at the farm and she got away," Comstock told Patch earlier this month. "She went through a big swamp area, and I met up with her on the other side. And then she looked at me and started walking toward [Route] 176. I followed her and she just looked at me and said, 'See ya.""

USDA Distributes \$1.5 Billion to Strengthen School Meal Program

Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack is announced this week that the Biden-Harris Administration is providing up to \$1.5 billion to states and school districts to help school meal program operators deal with the challenges of supply chain disruptions brought on by the pandemic. As the administration continues to work towards Building a Better America by investing in our communities, the funding announced today will help to provide our nation's children with the nutritious foods they need to thrive.

With funding made available through <u>USDA's Commodity Credit Corporation</u>, USDA will provide \$1 billion for schools to purchase food for their meal programs and another \$300 million for states to purchase foods to be distributed to schools. An additional \$200 million will be used for cooperative agreements to purchase local foods for schools with a focus on buying from historically underserved producers. A state-by-state breakdown of funds can be found in this table.

"USDA's school meal programs have a wide-reaching impact on the health and well-being of our nation's children," said Vilsack. "Now, more than ever, America's children need access to healthy and nutritious foods and our school nutrition professionals play a huge role in making that happen. Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, school districts have met extraordinary challenges to ensure that every child has the food needed to learn, grow and thrive. The food and funds USDA is distributing will help ensure schools have the resources they need to continue to serve our nation's schoolchildren quality food they can depend on, all while building a stronger, fairer, and more competitive food system."
