

Drought Resources

While the eastern Corn Belt received beneficial precipitation this week (especially Ohio), drought continues to rapidly intensify across most of the Midwest. The Mid-Atlantic also saw worsening conditions, with the introduction of Severe Drought (D2) in Maryland, Pennsylvania, and D.C. The good news: Heavy rainfall brought targeted drought improvements in the Intermountain West, western Southern Plains, and Florida Peninsula.

As of June 20, 2023, 22.67% of the U.S. and Puerto Rico and 27.11% of the lower 48 states are in drought, according to the <u>U.S. Drought Monitor</u>. 239.6 million acres of major crops in the U.S. are experiencing drough conditions this week, and 28 U.S. states are experiencing Moderate Drought (D1) or worse, up 12 from last month.

We encourage those impacted by drought to keep communication going with yourlocal Farm Service Agency and Ag Insurance provider- so you are at the front of the line for eligibility for disaster assistance programs. For example, the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) provides for emergency having and grazing on certain CRP practices in a county designated as D2 or higher on the U.S. Drought Monitor, or in a county where there is at least 40 percent loss in forage production.

The <u>National Drought Mitigation Center</u> offers a collection of information on what has been tried in responding to and preparing for drought in the United States. One great piece is on <u>reintroducing bison for grassland diversity</u>.

Help Recruit Sponsors for the Truth in Buffalo Labeling Act

The NBA's Truth in Buffalo Labeling Act has been introduced in both the Senate and House of the U.S. Congress. We now need your help to recruit co-sponsors for this legislation, which would prevent cheap, low-quality, imported water buffalo products from being deceptively labeled as simply "buffalo", which misleads consumers and negatively impacts the U.S. bison industry. The bipartisan bill provides the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) with the authority to ensure that products with water buffalo are

labeled as "water buffalo" so consumers aren't misled to believe the product contains bison. Bison products would continue to be labeled as "bison" or "buffalo". See the proposed legislation and current Congressional sponsors here.

The legislation in the Senate, S. 258, is being sponsored by U.S. Sens. John Hoeven (R-ND) and Michael Bennet (D-CO) Current Co-sponsors include:

Two People are Sought in Harassment of a Bison Calf at Grand Teton National Park

Chad Kremer, the president of the National Bison Association and a bison herd manager in South Dakota, said most instances of people getting close to calves are rooted in well-meaning intentions: They want to help a stray calf find its way to the herd or get out of difficult terrain.

But such efforts pose risks to the animal and the people, Mr. Kremer said.

"Even if they do appear to be lost or abandoned, typically that's not the case," he said. "When you begin intervening, it will just compound the problem."

Female bison sometimes put young calves in an area, leave them and go off grazing before coming back for their offspring, Mr. Kremer said. But if someone picks up the calf or moves it, that process is disrupted and the female bison may be deterred from returning because of the human scent on the animal.

Visitors can also be in danger, given that bison are the largest mammal in North America.

Male bison, also called bulls, weigh up to 2,000 pounds and stand six feet tall. Females, or cows, weigh up to 1,000 pounds and reach a height of four to five feet.

It is difficult to track the frequency in which people interfere with bison calves, Mr. Kremer said, but it is possible that there is more awareness of such episodes because of news coverage.

Hesitant bison calf pushed into river by its momma as herd flees bears Yahoo Sports

A family of grizzly bears in Yellowstone National Park sent a herd of bison running to escape, and in the herd were several newborn about to experience a river crossing for the first time.

While most of the calves jumped right into the water, one hesitant calf needing a bit of prodding. It's mother pushed it off the bank and into the water, as seen around the 2:20 mark of the video captured by Ron Sterbenz.

Sterbenz told USA Today/For The Win Outdoors that the bison mom "was done with her calf hesitating to cross so she head-butted him right into the river.

The incident occurred in Lamar Valley last month.

"It is always amazing when you remember that for many of these calves they were just born a few days before," Sterbenz told For The Win Outdoors. "Most of them had never swam or seen a river until that day. They were being chased off the 'Amethyst Bench' area in the Lamar Valley and towards the Lamar River by three grizzlies, one sow and her two 3-year-old cubs, all three clearly wanting to have a bison meal."

Bison reintroduced to Canada's Banff thrive again

Wild bison that once numbered in the tens of millions in North America before being hunted almost to extinction are once again thriving in a pocket of western Canada.

Appearing from a distance as specks against the backdrop of the Rocky Mountains, these animals are also restoring balance at the top of a fragile ecosystem.

North America's largest land mammal—growing to 900 kilograms (2,000 pounds) and 1.8 meters (six feet) high at the shoulders—suffered a dramatic decline in late 19th century due to hunting and habitat loss as settlers pushed westward.

They were reintroduced to what is now Banff National Park in 2017. "The moment the bison set foot on that landscape, it felt to me that I brought them home," says Wes Olson, who accompanied the first 16 bison to be released there.

13 bison calves at Minneopa bring herd size to 44

The bison calves at Minneopa State Park grow guickly.

"Some of the older ones you look at, they're starting to turn that brown color already," said Ashley Steevens, manager of the park. The first calves, who are a reddish color when born, were born in early May.

There were 13 calves born this spring, down some from the record 17 born last year.

Steevens said two of the cows from the herd were last year sent to Dakota County's Spring Lake Park, where they are establishing a bison herd.

The Minneopa herd now totals 44, but that number will decline later this year as the twoyear-old male bison will be sent to other partner herds in the state.

"We try to keep just one breeding bull," Steevens said. "Having one breeding bull, we know where our genetics are going."

The Minneopa herd, and others being established through the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, Minnesota Zoo and other partners, have pure genetics that don't have any beef genetics.

At this point it's unknown how many of the calves are males and females but park staff will learn later this year. "We have a management event each year where we do health checks and new ones are ear tagged and we check their genetics," Steevens said.

Minnesota Down Payment Assistance Grant Program

ATTRA June 15, 2023

Applications will be accepted July 1-31, 2023.

The Minnesota Down Payment Assistance Grant offers up to \$15,000 for qualified farmers to purchase their first farm. To qualify, farmers must earn less than \$250,000 per year in gross agricultural sales, and each award must be matched with at least \$8,000 of other funding.

A total of \$1 million in funding is available. After the application window closes, all eligible applications will be placed in a randomized lottery to determine the order in which grants are awarded. Preference for this round of awards will be given to emerging farmers.

US lawmakers float possible farm bill extension amid delays

WASHINGTON, June 22 (Reuters) - The U.S. Congress may need to pass a short-term extension of the country's current farm bill, the largest food and nutrition spending package, amid delays drafting the next one, the top lawmakers on the Senate and House farm committees said on Thursday.

The farm bill funds U.S. nutrition, conservation and commodity programs and is passed every five years. The current bill expires on Sept. 30.

Senator Debbie Stabenow, chairwoman of the Senate Agriculture Committee, said "it would not surprise me" if lawmakers passed a short-term extension of the current farm bill, as has happened on occasion with past bills.

"We can't give you a date (for a draft), but we're moving as quickly as we can," she said at an event hosted by Bloomberg Government.

The process of drafting the farm bill is behind schedule in part because hearings were delayed by the COVID-19 pandemic, said Representative Glenn "GT" Thompson, chairman of the House Agriculture Committee, at the event.
