### NBA Weekly Update for October 28, 2022



### 1839 Cherokee Meat Co. celebrates opening

TAHLEQUAH, OKLA. — To commemorate the opening of 1839 Cherokee Meat Co., representatives from Cherokee Nation Businesses held a dedication and ribbon-cutting ceremony on Oct. 24 in addition to hosting tours of the facility.

Named after the year Cherokee Nation became untied by the constitution, 1839 Cherokee Meat Co. is a USDA and state-certified meat processing facility located in Tahlequah, Okla. The 12,000 square-foot plant repurposes tribal property to support food security for Cherokee citizens.

"As the Cherokee people navigated through the pandemic, we learned valuable lessons about food security and food sovereignty," said Cherokee Nation Principal Chief Chuck Hoskin Jr. "By addressing the shortage of meat processing capacity with our own facility, we support local agriculture and locally sourced food all for the benefit of Cherokee citizens and the region's economy."

Hoskin along with Deputy Chief Bryan Warner and the Council of the Cherokee Nation instigated the construction of the facility, which is expected to expand in phases. Eventually, 1839 Cherokee Meat Co. will use surplus bison from Cherokee Nation's herd to meet their goal of a sustainable local farm-to-table operation.

The facility was funded through Cherokee Nation's COVID-19 Respond, Recover and Rebuild relief plan. A total of \$27 million in funds went to the facility, five new distribution centers and additional refrigerated trucks.

"I am so proud that during a difficult public health crisis Cherokee Nation business and government leaders could come together to not only address immediate challenges, but also make long term investments like the new 1839 Cherokee Meat Co.," Warner said.

## USDA Launches Loan Assistance Tool to Enhance Equity and Customer Service

WASHINGTON, Oct. 26, 2022 – The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) launched a new online tool to help farmers and ranchers better navigate the farm loan application process. This uniform application process will help to ensure all farm loan applicants receive equal support and have a consistent customer experience with USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) regardless of their individual circumstances.

"USDA recognizes more must be done to ensure all customers have equal access to our programs and services," said FSA Administrator Zach Ducheneaux. "The Loan Assistance

Tool is another example of USDA taking accountability and ensuring we update our existing systems, processes, and policies to make them equitable for all customers. The tool will help loan applicants better understand the application process and gather the needed documents before the process even begins."

USDA experiences a high rate of incomplete or withdrawn applications, particularly among underserved customers, due in part to a challenging and lengthy paper-based application process. The Loan Assistance Tool is available 24/7 and gives customers an online step-by-step guide that supplements the support they receive when working in person with a USDA employee, providing materials that may help an applicant prepare their loan application in one tool.

Farmers can access the Loan Assistance Tool by visiting <a href="farmers.gov/farm-loan-assistance-tool">farmers.gov/farm-loan-assistance-tool</a> and clicking the 'Get Started' button. From here they can follow the prompts to complete the Eligibility Self-Assessment and start the farm loan journey. The tool is built to run on any modern browser like Chrome, Edge, Firefox, or the Safari browser, and is fully functional on mobile devices. It does not work in Internet Explorer.

The Loan Assistance Tool is the first of multiple farm loan process improvements that will be available to USDA customers on farmers.gov in the future. Other improvements and tools that are anticipated to launch in 2023 include:

- A streamlined and simplified direct loan application, reduced from 29 pages to 13 pages.
- An interactive online direct loan application that gives customers a paperless and electronic signature option, along with the ability to attach supporting documents such as tax returns.
- An online direct loan repayment feature that relieves borrowers from the necessity of calling, mailing, or visiting a local Service Center to pay a loan installment.

### Carie Starr realizes her dream at Cherokee Valley Bison Ranch From Farm and Dairy

THORNVILLE, Ohio — In 2005, Carie Starr had a life-changing meal. At that time, she was living on 25 acres of her family's land, in Thornville, Ohio. Her grandparents originally owned that land as part of their 160-acre farm. They enjoyed harness racing and had most of the farm in hay production. They also kept a few other animals, like goats and cattle, over the years. Starr grew up around the farm and her grandparents, but never had any plans to be a farmer.

But near the end of 2005, she had dinner at Ted's Montana Grill, a restaurant in Columbus, to celebrate getting a new job. She wanted to try something new and adventurous, so she ordered bison prime rib.

"I was like, 'Oh my gosh, that's the most delicious thing I've ever eaten. I'd like to be able to eat that all the time' ... Well, I live in the middle of 25 acres. I could raise bison," she said.

By 2008, bison grazed the pastures around her. Now, in 2022, she has almost 50 of them at Cherokee Valley Bison Ranch.

### Meat and Poultry Processing Capacity Technical Assistance From USDA-AMS

USDA's Meat and Poultry Processing Capacity- Technical Assistance Program (MPPTA) ensures that participants in USDA's Meat and Poultry Supply Chain initiatives have access

full-range technical assistance (TA) to support their project development and success. These supply chain initiatives--including the <u>Meat and Poultry Inspection Readiness Grant (MPIRG) Program</u> and the Meat and Poultry Processing Expansion Program (MPPEP)--support the growth of domestic processing capacity and the ability of independent facilities to serve more customers in more markets.

USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) is investing up to \$25 million to establish a nationwide MPPTA network of support focusing on four key areas, or scopes:

- Federal Grant Application Management: Navigating federal grants processes and procedures, from pre-award applications processes through post-award grant management compliance;
- Business Development and Financial Planning: Business and financial planning resources, market intelligence, and project/concept feasibility analyses;
- Meat and Poultry Processing Technical and Operation Support: Advice and resources to support the operational needs--including workforce development--of processing plant development and utilization; and
- Supply Chain Development: Support for the development and maintenance of successful supply chain and marketing relationships—between suppliers, processors, distributors, and customers.

#### What does the MPPTA Offer?

- Access to technical experts from across industry, academia and state and federal government.
- Focused content for diverse stakeholders, including family-owned, rural, minority-owned, Native American and Tribal-owned businesses, and other underserved entities seeking to build or expand meat and poultry processing and supply chain capacity.
- General assistance with navigating USDA grant application and award processes, and successful post-award grant management
- One-one-one advising, including project and proposal reviews tailored to the specific needs of diverse stakeholders, from small and very small processors and new enterprise startups to organizations developing regional concepts and established mid-sized processing companies.
- Educational resources, events, and webinars covering topics of interest for meat and poultry processing enterprises of all types.

### Cleveland Metroparks Zoo welcomes three female bison

CLEVELAND — The Cleveland Metroparks Zoo's family continues to grow. This week, the zoo welcomed three new bison to its mix.

The zoo said all three females came from the Minnesota Zoo. Their names are Blue, 6 years old; Grun, 2 years old; and Topaz, 5 months old.

Bison are the largest mammal in North America, according to the U.S. Department of the Interior. The average female bison weighs up to 1,000 pounds and can be up to 4 to 5 feet. Males can weigh up to 2,000 pounds and reach 6 feet tall.

While they can be big, they can also run pretty fast. On average, they can run up to 35 mph.

Yellowstone National Park is the only area bison have roamed freely since prehistoric times, according to the U.S. Department of the Interior. They can live up to 20 years old.

### property in Belton

BELTON, Texas (KWTX) - Central Texas cowboys on horseback on Tuesday afternoon helped authorities in the city of Belton, corral, tranquilize, and capture a loose bison.

"It was pretty tough because he kept beating us into brush," said cowboy Joe Draper. "We couldn't get him to come out to where we could actually get a shot and get him roped and get him captured."

Paul Romer, a spokesperson with the City of Belton, told KWTX the animal, which belongs to a local rancher, escaped from a veterinarian's office on E. 6th Ave. at about 7:30 a.m. Tuesday.

It happened near the busy downtown area and "we're grateful it didn't go near a school bus," Romer said, "I've been working in Belton for 10 years now and nothing like this has ever happened. Thank goodness nobody got injured on the interstate. It was very scary to have this animal on the loose."

# District burger joint Bubba's Texas Burger Shack serves plates from under the highway

From icehouse to casual burger joint to Houston staple, Bubba's Texas Burger Shack has evolved alongside the city it calls home.

Originally located on the old Westheimer Road, the shack moved to its current abode on Westpark Drive in 1985, serving drinks with the occasional burger. Five years into its relocation, then-owner Bubba Gilliam sold the restaurant to one of its regular customers, Richard Reed.

Now, the former dive bar is run by another generation: Reed's daughters, Erin Fisher and Allison Boyd, with family friend Matt McCracken. The trio have taken charge of Bubba's, seeing the eatery through what they said have been the best and worst times of its history.

The dive was unique early on for the inclusion of bison beef in its burger patties. The meat is sourced from just outside Rapid City, South Dakota, through 777 Bison Ranch, they said.

When paired with a 27-ingredient spice blend, the burgers are one of a kind, Fisher said.
